WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

The program covers 5160 of women belonging to 344Self Help Groups (SHGs) in 52 Grama Panchayats in Chitguppa, Humnabad, Aurad, Hulsoor, Balki, Bidar and Basavakalyan taluks of Bidar district. The target groups of the program include rural women and adolescent girls.

Objectives

- ✧ Improve the level of literacy of adolescent girls and women.
- ✧ Increase the number of trained women in book keeping of Self Help Groups (SHGs) of women.
- ✧ Strengthen women with knowledge and awareness of basic rights of their own, their families and villages.
- ✧ Reduce the number of women and adolescent girls with ignorance on nutrition, health and sanitation.
- ✧ Promote Cluster and district level federations for economic self-sustainability of SHGs.
- ✧ Educate women on enhancing livelihood through entrepreneurship.

Where there is a will there is a way



In a young age, Sangeetha, from Indira Nagar Humnabad Taluk, got married, and she lived with her husband in Sindbandagi village in Humnabad Taluk where they owned a house. She is a second daughter-in-law in her husband's family. There are three children in her family, two boys and one girl. They are a joint family and at the beginning they were very happy with each other. It was a pleasure for Sangeetha to do all her work. She worked hard and was always willing to help others. However, after a few years, due to misunderstandings in the family, she, along with her children, left her husband's

house and went to her mother's house and never returned after that.

She joined the women-led self-help group of Sindbandgi village named Jyothi SHG while she was staying in her mother's house. After joining the SHG group she learned all about the rules and regulations as well as the whereabouts of the SHG group.

A regular visit by ORBIT staff from Women empowerment program was made to the SHGs to provide them with information about environment, sustainability, leadership, etc. As Sangeetha realized the importance of SHG groups and their benefits, she joined one in her village. She was inspired to live an independent life by this. She challenged herself to learn tailoring, purchase a sewing machine through a loan from SHG, save money from it, and take care of her family.

In accordance with her plan, she obtained a loan and purchased a tailoring machine. Prior to that, she had taken tailoring classes. She with the cooperation of her neighbors and relatives began to stitch the cloths and earn Rs. 300-450 per day. The good news is that her husband has moved to her house and they live together. He is helping her with her tailoring now. The family is happy now. They can live independently with their earnings.

Sangeetha is ever grateful to ORBIT for the support and help.

Meremma lives in Bathramba village, Bhalki Taluk, Bidar District. Daya Sagar SHG is one of the groups she belongs to. She lives with her husband and three children: a boy, and two girls. Her husband works as a painter in the local area. She comes from a poor family. Her husband's income wasn't enough to support her family. The income of her husband made it difficult for her to educate her three children.

The present situation of her family is better than earlier. Through the intervention of ORBIT staff, Meremma got to know about the women empowerment program, and

SHG groups initiated by ORBIT which works for the empowerment of the women. Later she expressed her desire to join the SHG. It's been 15 years since she is with SHG. She took a loan of Rs. 50,000 and Rs. 25,000 from Samruddi scheme and bought 5 goats. Every year through breeding and selling of goats, she managed the finances of the family and educated their children as well.

At present she owns many goats, she is also earning the money by going to the coolly work. Through the goat rearing Meremma was able to improve the economic condition of her family. Her children are regularly going to the school now. She participated in the awareness programs organized for the SHG members and acquired information on Panchayath, health, leadership, etc. and learned about the schemes and entitlements available from various departments. Her social life expanded as she interacted with other members of the society. She related with everyone amiably and the people liked her approach.

Meremma is grateful to ORBIT for all the support and knowledge she has received from ORBIT. Though her income was limited, she was punctual in her savings. She is now convinced of the value of education and wants her children to be educated.

Dropout children's were enrolled to the School.

Rag picking was being done by a group of children and their parents in Ashrya Colony and Teachers Colony of Humnabad Taluk Bidar District. Family members earn their income mainly through rag picking. Children could not attend school due to financial constraints. They were deprived of education.

A child line team conducted a raid in Humnabad Taluk and found these children engaged in rag picking. When they asked the children why they were doing so, they replied that they were poor and did not have an Adhar card, ration card, or any other government benefits. As a result, none of the government's services are available to them.

Later, the child line team visited the house and assessed the conditions. It was discovered that Ramesh and Geetha are Scheduled Tribes from Budabudakere galli with three sons, all boys. 10 years old Govind, 8 years old Devindra, and 6 years old Vishvanath. Ramesh is alcoholic and regularly tortures his wife. The money does not go to his family. It is therefore difficult for the family to earn their daily bread. As a result, the mother and the children are engaged in rag picking.

Children were referred to the CWC office at Bidar by the child line staff on 5.08.2023. Within a short time, child and women welfare officers, social welfare officers, police department, and child line staff from ORBIT visited Dhangargalli Village in Humnabad



taluk. In the place, more than 200 people gathered. All of them were made aware not to send their children to rag picking. If they do so action will be taken against them.

Later the children were taken to the nearby school, were admitted, books and other stationery was provided by the school thus the children were rescued from rag picking. The follow up visit ensured that the children were continuing their studies.

NAVAJEEVANA - Community Based Reintegration of Persons with Mental Illness (Supported by Ajim Prem ji Foundation)



Goal/ Impact Statement: All identified Persons with mental illness from poor communities of Humnabad Taluqof Bidar District with severe or common Mental Illness access treatment (from DMHP), stabilized and at least 25% of them practice livelihood activities thereby integrated in the community by March, 2025.

Objectives

1. Identify all the people with mental illness in Humnabad, taluqof Bidar District to ensure treatment and reintegration for all the identified PWMI and families and to implement, promote and sustain District Mental Health Programme in the District.
2. To capacitate staff of Navajeevana, barefoot counselors, teachers and to sensitize secondary stakeholders and Govt Dept. staff for the effective implementation of mental health programme in Humnabad Taluq.
3. To impart Income Generation, vocational training for at least one member from affected families (rehabilitated PWMI or Caregivers) for livelihood through wage or self-employment
4. To set up a "Help Line" for PWMIs, people, students and youth with depression, to provide counseling services and treatment.

Success story

Mrs Geetha (name changed) is the wife of Anand Kumar. She lives in Bibi galli Humnabad Taluk Bidar District. It is their own house that they live in. The responsibility for the house is taken care of by her husband who is the head of the household. The man is a good man, he knew clearly that his wife is mentally ill, yet he cared for her lovingly even though he knew that she was sick. Mrs. Geetha was a housewife who performed all her household duties faithfully and dedicatedly. They have three children, two girls and one boy. They went to a Govt School in Humnabad. Mrs. Geetha worked hard. Though she was a housewife, she accomplished all her work diligently.



In the year 2008 the behavior of Geetha changed day by day. She stopped eating regularly, got angry and was irritated by her husband and children. Smiling, crying and talking by her, when someone talked with her she got angry, fought with her family members etc. Having noticed this changes her husband took her to Eragadda hospital Hyderabad. After the consultation of the doctor she was advised to take regular medicine.

In the year 2019 the Navajeevana staff from ORBIT visited her house as they were talking they realized that she was a person with mental illness. She continued to tell them that she is under medication from Hyderabad hospital, and sometimes she stopped taking medicines due to economical problem. By here this staff of Naajeevana used this opportunity to help Mrs Geetha as it was possible. They told her about the free mental health camp that is conducted at Govt Hospital Humnabad every Wednesday. They collected all the data of the person and made record of it.

The staff of Navajeevana continued to visit her house, made a follow up and checked

whether she is taking the medicines regularly. After two years there was a change in Geetha she was able to manage her house. She continued to come to Govt hospital for District mental Health program every month. As a result Geetha was able to recover day by day and found joy in her face.

Family Background: Anu, 6 year old girl, native of Hallikhed (B) daughter of Mr. Yashwanth and Mrs. Shobha. She has two older sisters who are going to the school and one brother. Her father is a Lorry driver and he takes the responsibility of the house. Annu is youngest of all who is with delay development. They live in a poor family, poor economic condition.

Before Intervention: The child's family is nuclear; her parents neglected her in the beginning believing that the child would never be able to recover. There was no referral to any hospital or medication for her; they simply neglected her. Through the help of Anganvadi teachers, ORBIT staff from Early Intervention and Early Education visited Annu's house to learn about her. They told them about their work and what APD can do for them, as well as the follow-up and benefits that can come from it. Through follow-up

exercises and continued exercise, they promised the child would recover. As a result, the parents agreed and gave all the information they had about the child to the agency.

After Intervention: We have registered this child with the help of Anganwadi Teacher and suggested the parents that child need physiotherapy, we assessed the children with the help of master trainers from APD. That time child had delay in Sitting, Standing and walking. After the assessment, intense service provided for the child with the involvement of parents. The Early Interventionist from ORBIT visited her house regularly made her to sit and walk holding their hands and asked the parents to repeat the same. The early interventionist also made the child to sit in the tub on the bed sheets and clothes, thus the child can sit easily.

Achievement: At present the child can sit without support for some extent, walk with support and now she is under the supervision of her mother. The parents show interest in this child. They take good care of her. Daily exercises are given by the parents; they make the child to walk holding their hand. The early interventionist also makes the follow up visit once in a month and find out the condition of the child. They are very happy with the services of early intervention. There is lot of efforts to put in for the growth of this child in the future.

Before Intervention: The child Sakshi is 5 years old, and lives with her parents, siblings and other members of her family in a joint household. During the day, she is taken care of by her mother while her father works as coolly. Sakshi is unable to walk and has a speech impediment. The parents have not fully taken care of this child; their thinking is that medicine would not help the child recover from disability. It is because of this, that family members did not take her to any hospital for treatment.

After Intervention: The Early interventionist from ORBIT was able to identify the child Sakshi through Anganwadi visit. In reference to this the early interventionist visited her house and convinced the parents, gave them awareness about the possibilities of cure through treatment and other exercises. We have registered this child with the help of Anganwadi Teachers and suggested the parents that child need physiotherapy. After the assessment, intense service provided for the child with the involvement of parents.

Achievement: The child started walking slowly without the help of others. The mother is convinced about the physiotherapy and other treatment for the betterment of the child. The Early interventionists from ORBIT are making all the efforts to bring changes in Sakshi's life by visiting the houses, giving the exercises, holding the hand and making the child to walk, making the child to repeat some words like Amma, appa etc. As a result the child now talks few words like papa mamma etc. She is walking slowly without support. Regular follow-up is done by the early interventionist. The neighbors also appreciate saying that there is much difference in Sakshi after the intervention of ORBIT.



Skill Development and Income Generation Program (SDIGP)

In order to empower the youth and women who are unemployed and unskilled, ORBIT organizes skill development programmes on Driving, Garment Making/ Tailoring, Rexene Bag making, Beautician, Paper bag making, Basic computer etc.

- Enhanced productivity of vulnerable and backward communities by developing skills and assets.
- Promoting greater income generation and vocational training opportunities.
- Promotion of micro credit units to promote the business and growth.
- Empowering people to self manage and run their own livelihood with their own capabilities

Success Story (Tailoring) Pooja

Pooja, the wife of Krishna, resides in Hillaalpur village, Humnabad Taluk, Bidar District. She was married at the age of 21. There are two children in the family: a boy and a girl. She does not own any property or belongings. She belongs to a joint family and holds a BPL card. Despite having some knowledge of tailoring, Pooja wanted to learn more and earn money so that she could live independently. Taking care of her family and working on her own was her life's goal. Since her children were small and her family did not support her at that time, she stayed at home and did housework as a homemaker.



One day the staff from ORBIT visited the house of Pooja and gave information about the tailoring classes that will be taken place in her own village for two months. Hearing this, Pooja felt happy and she approached her husband and asked for the permission. Discussing with her family members they allowed her to go for the classes.

Pooja registered her name for the training with all the required documents. Taking part in the training program at Hillaalpur for two months was fruitful in Pooja's life. She expresses that ORBIT has given her opportunity to fulfill her goal. With her experience, she has been able to stitch garments of all kinds for males and females.

She has purchased the sewing machine. Stitched the garments of her family members first, since that was a brand-new starting point. Seeing this neighbors and relatives also started giving the garments for tailoring. At present she is earning Rs. 200 to 300 per day. It is a big help for her to run the family. Pooja is ever grateful to ORBIT and all those who are part

Successful To Be A Beautician

Sunitha 28years old from Grace Colony, Humnabad Taluk, Bidar district lives with her father Mr John, two brother and one younger sister. She has no mother. Sunitha completed her PUC and was at home taking care of her family since her mother died. Her father works in a shop as a shop keeper. She had great desire to work and earn money. She desired that she should live a happy life. But due to some family issues she could not manage to go for work outside. Therefore she remained at home and took care of the family.



One day the friend of Sunitha came to her home and expressed that there is a beautician course conducted by ORBIT for 2 months. She was extremely happy to learn about the two months Beautician course offered by ORBIT in collaboration with MISSIO. She got admission with great enthusiasm and she learnt eyebrow, facials, hairstyles, bleach, and so on. Systematically and obtained the certificate as she was familiar with the Skill, visiting her friend's Beauty Parlor. Now she is able to earn from Rs. 5000/ to 6000 in the season time.



She has opened one beauty parlor in her home. Many people come and beautify themselves. She is a teacher for two months beautician course with 14 trainees. She gets a salary of Rs 5,000/- and the income from her customer service too. Her experience sharing is an inspiration for her trainees too.

Sunitha is grateful to ORBIT and Missio for giving an opportunity to learn the beautician course. She expresses that she is independent now. She can manage her life without the help of others.
